6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 63.2-1104 of the Code of Virginia, relating to interstate placement of
7	children.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 63.2-1104 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 63.2-1104. Children from other states and countries.
11	A. Any child-placing agency or court that brings or sends, or causes to be brought or sent, a
12	nonresident child into Virginia for the purpose of an interstate placement shall comply with the
13	regulations and procedures adopted by the Board for the administration of the Interstate Compact on the
14	Placement of Children (§ 63.2-1000 et seq.) regardless of whether the state from which the child is sent
15	is a party to the compact. The agency shall also comply with all the regulations of the Board relating to
16	nonresident children so brought or sent into the Commonwealth. Intercountry placements made by
17	licensed child-placing agencies, courts, or other entities are subject to regulations prescribed by the
18	Board.
19	B. The Board is authorized to adopt regulations for the bringing or sending of such children into the
20	Commonwealth by child-placing agencies or courts for the purpose of an interstate placement, and for
21	the care, maintenance, supervision and control of all children so brought or sent into the Commonwealth
22	until they have been adopted, attained their majority, or have been otherwise lawfully discharged or

released, as are reasonably conducive to the welfare of such children and as comply with the provisions
of the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (§ 63.2-1000 et seq.).

C. Regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to this section shall not prohibit the placement of a nonresident child in a children's residential facility in the Commonwealth by a custodial parent who assumes full financial responsibility for the child prior to final approval of the placement pursuant to the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children when the placement is made without the involvement of a public officer or agency.

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
