9 10	WHEREAS, citizens in the Commonwealth and across the nation are increasingly interested in
11	tracing their genealogical roots; and
12	WHEREAS, state law determines when certain records are released to the public and how accessible
13	such records are when they are released; and
14	WHEREAS, private organizations have partnered with several states to index their public records in a
15	manner that makes these records more accessible to the public; and
16	WHEREAS, there may be a way to make public records more accessible at little or no cost to the
17	Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it
18	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
19 20	Review Commission be directed to study the feasibility of vital records automation indexing.
20 21	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) examine alternatives available for the automation indexing of vital records in the Commonwealth; (ii) consider
²¹ 22	costs, accessibility, privacy implications, and other practical implications for each option; and (iii) make
$\frac{22}{23}$	recommendations to the General Assembly for any necessary changes to state law to implement the most
24	feasible option.
25	Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the
26	State Registrar of Vital Records. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the
27	Commission for this study, upon request.
28	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30,
29	2012, and the Chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
30	summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2013 Regular Session of
31	the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Commission intends to submit to
32 33	the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as
33 34	a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents
3 4 35	and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
