2. Patron: Poindexter

3. Committee: House Committee for Courts of Justice

4. Title: Methamphetamine site cleanup costs ordered paid by defendant.

5. Summary: Provides that if property owned by a person convicted of manufacture of methamphetamine is damaged, destroyed, or otherwise rendered unusable as a result of such methamphetamine manufacture, the court shall order the person to pay the estimated or actual expenses associated with cleanup, removal, or repair of the affected property or, if actual or estimated expenses cannot be determined, the sum of \$10,000, to the Methamphetamine Cleanup Fund.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate (see Item 8)

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation creates the Methamphetamine Cleanup Fund ("Fund") to ensure the remediation of the affected property back to safe environmental standards. Since it cannot be determined what level of resources might be generated through this provision or whether the resources are sufficient to cover all cleanup related costs, the impact on the state cannot be determined.
