4.	Title: Virginia Employment Commission; representation of Commonwealth.
5.	Summary: This bill makes optional the representation by the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) in hearings conducted before the Virginia Employment Commission (VEC) regarding an employer's tax liability. Currently, OAG representation in such hearings is mandatory.
6.	Budget Amendment Necessary: No.
7.	Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary.
8.	Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this bill will not result in a fiscal impact to the state. The bill makes it optional for a representative from the OAG to attend administrative hearings on tax liability held by VEC. Current state law mandates that the interests of the Commonwealth are to be represented by the OAG at each of the 20-25 hearings per year regarding an employer's tax liability. According to VEC, these cases rarely present novel

According to VEC, it is the agency's intention to execute an administrative agreement (such as a memorandum of understanding) with the OAG to negotiate terms and conditions under which it will be determined that OAG representation is not necessary. Without such an agreement, there is the potential that the interests of the Commonwealth may not be fully represented.
