4. Title: Emergency management plans; victims' rights.

5. Summary: Requires the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) and the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund division of the Workers' Compensation Commission to be the lead responding state entities for individuals determined to be victims during critical events and emergencies under emergency management plans developed by school boards, institutions of higher education, the Board of Health, the State Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, the Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM), and political subdivisions.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is not anticipated that this legislation would have a material fiscal impact on the fiscal resources of DCJS or CICF. This legislation requires that current contact information for DCJS and CICF be maintained in each emergency management plan. Further, DCJS and CICF are to be contacted and serve as lead coordinators once an emergency management plan is activated.
