Overweight vehicle permits and fees

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would provide a uniform fee structure for permits on overweight vehicles. Currently, codified fee amounts vary by vehicle type. The bill would authorize single trip permits or annual permits and charge fees based on the weight of the vehicle. The funding generated is to be deposited in the Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund (HMOF), with a portion to be retained by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) for administrative costs. The bill also allows cities, towns and counties that maintain secondary streets to enter into an agreement with DMV to issue permits on behalf of the locality. The bill contains an effective date of January 1, 2013.

8. Fiscal Implications: This fiscal impact statement has been revised to show the expenditure impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The proposed legislation would equalize the fee structure for overweight vehicle permits. The additional revenue charged would compensate the Commonwealth for the additional wear on state highways caused by overweight vehicles. Since maintenance needs currently exceed revenues in the HMOF, funding is transferred from the construction program. Therefore, any additional funding deposited in the HMOF will in turn provide funding for

highway construction projects. DMV would incur a one-time expense of \$235,000 to modify the agency's systems to accommodate the new permit structure and process improvements. The expenditure can be absorbed by the agency's revenues.
