3. Committee: Passed both Houses

4. Title: Methamphetamine lab clean-up costs; reimbursement of localities.

5. Summary: Provides localities the means to seek reimbursement for actual expenses associated with the cleanup, removal, or repair of affected property from any person convicted of an offense for the manufacture of methamphetamine pursuant to § 18.2-248 or § 18.2-248.03. The amount charged shall not exceed actual expenses associated with cleanup, removal, or repair of the affected property.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate. Final.

8. Fiscal Implications: The fiscal impact resulting from this legislation cannot be determined since the number of localities that would enact such an ordinance is unknown, nor the amount of funding that might be collected from offenders. However, if an ordinance is enacted by the locality, any revenue received for the cleanup costs related to a methamphetamine lab could result in lowering cleanup costs for the involved locality (or other law enforcement entity).
