4. Title: Increased penalties for sex crimes

#### 5. Summary:

Generally, under current law, anyone convicted of rape, forcible sodomy, or object sexual penetration against a victim under 13 years old is subject to a mandatory minimum sentence of 25 years in prison. If the offense is the offender's second or subsequent violent sexual offense, the law requires a life sentence.

The proposed legislation would impose a mandatory minimum sentence of life imprisonment for the first conviction of rape, forcible sodomy, or object sexual penetration if the victim is less than 13 years old.

- **6. Budget Amendment Necessary**: Yes. Item 389. The Governor has submitted an executive amendment to the budget bill providing the appropriation for the fiscal impact of this legislation.
