3. Committee: Militia, Police and Public Safety

4. Title: Department of State Police; establishment of cold case searchable database.

5. Summary: Provides that the Superintendent of State Police may establish and maintain a cold case searchable database including unsolved homicide, missing person, and unidentified person cases. The searchable database may include interactive elements consisting of (i) the type of case, (ii) the location of where the crime was committed, (iii) the law-enforcement agency name, and (iv) the year the crime occurred.
