- **8. Fiscal Implications:** Requiring only one license plate will result in a reduction in expenditures for the Department of Motor Vehicles due to lower license plate and decal costs. The agency purchases plates from the Department of Corrections (DOC). Based on DOC data, decal costs, and passenger plate sales data, the estimated expenditure reduction would be approximately \$2.3 million per year. The impact on DOC would primarily relate to reduced raw material expenditures, with a negligible impact on Correctional Enterprise operations. A one-time expenditure from existing resources of \$13,000 in FY 2012 would be required for programming to support the provisions of this bill.
