**3. Committee:** Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services

**4. Title:** Alcoholic beverage control (ABC); mixed beverage license for certain motor sports facilities.

**5. Summary:** Creates an annual mixed beverage motor sports facility license for persons operating concessions at an outdoor motor sports facility that hosts a NASCAR national touring race. The bill sets out the privileges of the license and the state and local license taxes.

Fiscal Implications:** If this legislation passes, the annual mixed beverage motor sports facility state license tax would be \$560, with the possibility of a local annual mixed beverage motor sports facility license tax of up to \$300. According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, this legislation is not expected to have any material fiscal impact on the agency.
