2 An Act to amend and reenact § 8.01-397 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Deadman's Statute; 3 corroboration of testimony by business records.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

1. That § 8.01-397 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 7

8 § 8.01-397. Corroboration required and evidence receivable when one party incapable of 9 testifying (subdivision (b)(5) of Supreme Court Rule 2:804 derived from this section).

10 In an action by or against a person who, from any cause, is incapable of testifying, or by or against the committee, trustee, executor, administrator, heir, or other representative of the person so incapable of 11 12 testifying, no judgment or decree shall be rendered in favor of an adverse or interested party founded on 13 his uncorroborated testimony. In any such action, whether such adverse party testifies or not, all entries, memoranda, and declarations by the party so incapable of testifying made while he was capable, relevant 14 15 to the matter in issue, may be received as evidence in all proceedings including without limitation those to which a person under a disability is a party. The phrase "from any cause" as used in this section shall 16 not include situations in which the party who is incapable of testifying has rendered himself unable to 17 18 testify by an intentional self-inflicted injury.

19 For the purposes of this section, and in addition to corroboration by any other competent evidence, 20 an entry authored by an adverse or interested party contained in a business record may be competent 21 evidence for corroboration of the testimony of an adverse or interested party. If authentication of the 22 business record is not admitted in a request for admission, such business record shall be authenticated 23 by a person other than the author of the entry who is not an adverse or interested party whose conduct

24 is at issue in the allegations of the complaint. HB1477ER
