13105260D **HOUSE BILL NO. 1999** 1 2 3 4 5 6 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health on February 14, 2013) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Greason) A BILL to require the Board of Education to develop a grading system for individual school 7 performance. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 **1.** § 1. That the Board of Education shall report individual school performance using a grading system 10 in addition to the standards of accreditation. Such grading system shall be based on both state and federal accountability requirements and include student growth in assigning grades. The grading system shall be based on an A-to-F grading scale and shall include the school's accreditation rating. The 11 12 Board, by October 1, 2015, shall (i) develop the grading system; (ii) make both the system and the 13 14 grade assigned to each school in the Commonwealth available to the public; and (iii) report to the 15 General Assembly a summary of the system and the assigned grades. As used in this act, for purposes of assigning grades, "student growth" means (i) moving from one 16 performance level to a higher performance level on state assessments or additional assessments 17 approved by the Board; (ii) maintaining a proficient or advanced proficient performance level on state 18 assessments; or (iii) making significant improvement within the below basic or basic level of 19 20 performance on reading or mathematics assessments as determined by the Board. The Board may also 21 consider student growth percentiles (SGPs) as a factor in assigning grades. The Board shall assign grades to each public school based on the following criteria: 22 23 1. A grade of A means a school (i) received a rating of fully accredited; (ii) scored a 25 percent or 24 higher advanced proficiency pass rate on state assessments in each content area, using the three-year 25 trailing average methodology; and (iii) meets all federal annual measurable objectives (AMOs); 26 2. A grade of B means a school (i) received a rating of fully accredited and (ii) scored an advanced 27 proficiency pass rate less than 25 percent; 28 3. A grade of C means a school received a rating of accredited with warning in one content area 29 only: 30 4. A grade of D means a school (i) received a rating of accredited with warning in more than one 31

A grade of D means a school (1) received a rating of accredited with warning in more than one
content area; (ii) received a rating of provisionally accredited—graduation rate; or (iii) is a priority
school that was not denied accreditation or received a rating of conditionally accredited—reconstituted
school; and
A grade of F means a school was denied accreditation or received a rating of conditionally

5. A grade of F means a school was denied accreditation or received a rating of conditionally
accredited—reconstituted school.

36 § 2. That the Board of Education shall not assign grades until student growth factors are included
37 in the determination of grades.

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
