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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 23-9.3 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the State Council of Higher 3 Education.

- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6
- 7 1. That § 23-9.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 § 23-9.3. State Council of Higher Education for Virginia created; purpose; membership; terms; 9 officers.

10 (a) A. There is hereby created a State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the Council. The purpose of the Council shall be, through the exercise of the 11 12 powers and performance of the duties set forth in this chapter, to advocate and promote the 13 development and operation of an educationally and economically sound, vigorous, progressive, and 14 coordinated system of higher education in the Commonwealth of Virginia and to lead state-level 15 strategic planning and policy development and implementation based on research and analysis and in accordance with § 23-38.87:10 and subsection B of § 23-38.88. The Council shall also seek to facilitate 16 17 collaboration among institutions of higher education that will enhance quality and create operational 18 efficiencies and shall work with institutions of higher education and their boards on board development. 19 B. The Council shall be composed of persons selected from the Commonwealth at large without 20 regard to political affiliation but with due consideration of geographical representation. Appointees shall have demonstrated experience, knowledge, and understanding of higher education and workforce needs. 21 Appointees shall be selected for their ability and all appointments shall be of such nature as to aid the 22 23

work of the Council and to inspire the highest degree of cooperation and confidence. No officer, employee, trustee, or member of the governing board of any institution of higher education, no 24 25 employee of the Commonwealth, except the Superintendent of Public Instruction, or member of the 26 General Assembly, or member of the State Board of Education shall be eligible for appointment to the 27 Council except as hereinafter specified in this section. All members of the Council shall be deemed 28 members at large charged with the responsibility of serving the best interests of the whole 29 Commonwealth. No member shall act as the representative of any particular region or of any particular 30 institution of higher education.

31 (b) C. The Council shall consist of eleven 13 members: 12 members appointed by the Governor and 32 subject to confirmation by the General Assembly at its next regular session and one ex officio member. 33 At least one appointee shall have served as a president or chief executive of a public institution of 34 higher education in the Commonwealth. At least one member shall be a sitting Virginia school superintendent, either at the state or local level. The President of the Virginia Economic Development 35 Partnership shall serve ex officio with voting privileges. All terms shall begin July 1. Members shall be 36 37 appointed for four-year terms, except that appointments to fill vacancies occurring shall be for the 38 unexpired term.

39 (c) D. No person having served on the Council for two terms of four years shall be eligible for 40 reappointment to the Council for two years thereafter. 41

42 (e) E. The Council shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from its own membership and appoint 43 a secretary and such other officers as it deems necessary or advisable, and shall prescribe their duties 44 and term of office.

45 F. At each meeting, the Council shall involve the presidents of the public institutions of higher education in its agenda. The presidents shall present information and comment on issues of common 46 47 interest. The presidents shall choose presenters to the Council from among themselves who reflect the 48 diversity of the institutions.

49 At each meeting, the Council may involve other groups, including the presidents of private, nonprofit 50 institutions of higher education in its agenda.

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
