HOUSE BILL NO. 8

A BILL to amend and reenact § 29.1-740 of the Code of Virginia, relating to duty of certain persons in vessels to report boating accidents; penalty.

Patron—Edmunds

Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 29.1-740 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 29.1-740. Duty to stop and render assistance; penalties for violations; reporting of accident by bassengers.

A. It shall be the duty of every operator of a vessel involved in a collision to stop and render assistance as required by § 29.1-739. If any person knowingly fails to comply with the provisions of § 29.1-739 when the collision, accident or other casualty results in serious bodily injury to, or the death of, any person, he shall be is guilty of a Class 6 felony. If any person knowingly fails to comply with the provisions of § 29.1-739, when the collision, accident or other casualty results only in damage to property, he shall be is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. However, if the vessel struck is unattended and the damage is less than fifty dollars \$50, such person shall be punished only by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars \$50.

B. If the operator of a vessel knowingly fails to comply with the provisions of § 29.1-739, every person in the vessel who is 16 years of age or older and has knowledge of the accident shall have a duty to ensure that a report is made pursuant to subsection B of § 29.1-739. Any such passenger who fails to file a report of the accident is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
