16 WHEREAS, John Vaughan also served as a member of the board of Webb Furniture Enterprises from 1976 to 2005 and as its chief executive officer from 1996 to 2005; and 17

18 WHEREAS, John Vaughan led Vaughan Furniture as it grew to become one of the area's largest 19 employers and took an active role on numerous boards and in various associations related to the 20 furniture industry; and

21 WHEREAS, John Vaughan was recognized for his many contributions to the industry with induction 22 into the American Furniture Hall of Fame and the American Home Furnishings Alliance's Distinguished 23 Service Award; and

24 WHEREAS, committed to the well-being of Galax, John Vaughan served nine years on the Galax 25 City Council, including one term as mayor, and worked to ensure the efficient and effective operation of local government for area residents; and 26

27 WHEREAS, John Vaughan took an active role in community affairs, serving as a founding member 28 of the Twin County Regional Hospital board of trustees, chairing the committee that raised millions of 29 dollars for the Galax Public Library, and helping found the Galax Foundation for Excellence in 30 Education: and

31 WHEREAS, John Vaughan also chaired the Twin County United Way, the local division of the Boy 32 Scouts of America, the Oak Hill Academy board of trustees, and the local Carroll-Grayson Shrine Club 33 horse shows to benefit the Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children; and

WHEREAS, John Vaughan helped found the Galax Elks Lodge and was a longtime member of the 34 35 Old Town Masonic Lodge and the Kazim Shrine Temple, a lifelong member of First Baptist Church of 36 Galax, and a generous supporter of the Galax Volunteer Fire Department; and

37 WHEREAS, a vital part of the Galax community, John Vaughan made many substantial and lasting 38 contributions to the city and touched the lives of countless individuals through his civic and business 39 affairs; and

40 WHEREAS, a devoted family man, John Vaughan will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by 41 his wife of 60 years, Anne; children, William, John, Karen, and Amy, and their families; and numerous other family members, friends, and admirers; now, therefore, be it 42
