4 5	designations; state song designated.

9	Whereas, the Commonwealth has no official song because "Carry Me Back to Old Virginny,"
10 11	declared the official song of the Commonwealth in 1940, was declared the official song emeritus of the Commonwealth in 1997; and
11	Whereas, the official song should reference the rich tradition of the Commonwealth and invoke
13	images of the natural and scenic beauty its citizens celebrate; and
14	Whereas, the Commonwealth requires an official song that can be sung on all occasions with pride
15	and affection; and
16	Whereas, "Shenandoah" meets these melodic and lyrical requirements, the words of which are as
17 18	follows: Oh, Shenandoah, I hear you calling,
10 19	Calling me back home to you,
20	Shenandoah I have wandered widely throughout this land and across the seas,
21	On Shenandoah, there is no other that can match your beauty.
22	
23 24	From mountains, valleys, and beautiful people,
24 25	Shenandoah, I hear you calling, Calling me back home to you,
2 6	Bring me closer to glowing hearts,
27	Greet me when I see you again.
28	Whereas, "Shenandoah" is worthy of designation as the official song of the Commonwealth; now,
29	therefore, Be it expected by the Conord Assembly of Vinginia.
30 31	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 1-510 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
32	§ 1-510. Official emblems and designations.
33	The following are hereby designated official emblems and designations of the Commonwealth:
34	Artisan Center - "Virginia Artisans Center," located in the City of Waynesboro.
35	Bat - Virginia Big-eared bat (Corynorhinos townsendii virginianus).
36 37	Beverage - Milk. Blue Ridge Folklore State Center - Blue Ridge Institute located in the village of Ferrum.
38	Boat - "Chesapeake Bay Deadrise."
39	Cabin Capital of Virginia - Page County.
40	Coal Miners' Memorial - The Richlands Coal Miners' Memorial located in Tazewell County.
41 42	Covered Bridge Capital of the Commonwealth - Patrick County. Covered Bridge Festival - Virginia Covered Bridge Festival held in Patrick County.
42 43	Dog - American Foxhound.
44	Emergency medical services museum - "To The Rescue," located in the City of Roanoke.
45	Fish (Freshwater) - Brook Trout.
46	Fish (Saltwater) - Striped Bass.
47 48	Fleet - Replicas of the three ships, Susan Constant, Godspeed, and Discovery, which comprised the
40 49	Commonwealth's founding fleet that brought the first permanent English settlers to Jamestown in 1607, and which are exhibited at the Jamestown Settlement in Williamsburg.
50	Flower - American Dogwood (Cornus florida).
51	Folk dance - Square dancing, the American folk dance that traces its ancestry to the English Country
52	Dance and the French Ballroom Dance, and is called, cued, or prompted to the dancers, and includes
53 54	squares, rounds, clogging, contra, line, the Virginia Reel, and heritage dances.
54 55	Fossil - Chesapecten jeffersonius. Gold mining interpretive center - Monroe Park, located in the County of Fauquier.
56	Insect - Tiger Swallowtail Butterfly (Papilio glaucus Linne).
57	Motor sports museum - "Wood Brothers Racing Museum and Virginia Motor Sports Hall of Fame,"
58	located in Patrick County.
