4	Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study reorganizing all state
5	law-enforcement agencies under the Virginia State Police. Report.

10	WHEREAS, the responsibility for the prevention and detection of crime and the enforcement of the
11	laws of the Commonwealth is currently spread among numerous state agencies; and
12	WHEREAS, the citizens of Virginia expect the Commonwealth to employ professional
13	law-enforcement officers who enforce the laws of the Commonwealth across the state with consistency
14 15	and fairness; and
15 16	WHEREAS, it is important to ensure that law-enforcement agencies are accountable and operating as statutorily authorized; and
17	WHEREAS, consolidation of government functions often provides significant cost savings for the
18	Commonwealth; and
19	WHEREAS, the primary state law-enforcement agency in the Commonwealth is the Virginia State
20	Police; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
22	Review Commission be directed to study reorganizing all state law-enforcement agencies under the
23 24	Virginia State Police. In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) identify all state
24 25	agencies that employ law-enforcement officers; (ii) examine the history, budget, and current activities of
2 6	each law-enforcement agency or division within an agency; (iii) determine whether those agencies or
27	divisions are adequately and cost-effectively performing their statutory law-enforcement duties; and (iv)
28	make recommendations for the consolidation of all law-enforcement agencies under the Virginia State
29	Police.
30	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review
31 32	Commission for this study, upon request.
32 33	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2013, and for the second year by November 30, 2014, and the Chairman shall submit to
33 34	the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and
35	recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for
36	each year. Each executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and Review
37	Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and
38	recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports
39	shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
40	the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's
41	website.
