WHEREAS, an intelligent and gifted young woman, Leeser Howell was the salutatorian of her
 graduating class at Georgia Tyler High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree from the Norfolk

WHEREAS, as an undergraduate, Leeser Howell was listed among Who's Who Among Students in
American Universities and Colleges and was a charter member of the Epsilon Theta Chapter of Delta
Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.; she also pursued graduate studies at Hampton Institute, now Hampton
University; and

18 WHEREAS, a popular and effective teacher, Leeser Howell shared her love of music with her
19 students as a teacher with Norfolk Public Schools for 23 years and as a private instructor, helping them
20 gain an appreciation for music and develop their own musical talents; and

WHEREAS, Leeser Howell was the organist and choir director for First Church of Christ Holiness,
 St. Paul Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, and Mount Pleasant Baptist Church, and the pianist at
 New Calvary Baptist Church; her musical training and experience ensured that services were
 accompanied by uplifting music of worship and praise; and

WHEREAS, Leeser Howell took great pride in her family, raising two children, and supporting her
 husband in his profession and public service, while enriching the lives of those with whom she came in
 contact with her musical talents, gracious manner, and compassionate heart; and

WHEREAS, Leeser Howell will be greatly missed by her husband of 49 years, Delegate Algie T.
Howell, Jr.; children, Algie T. Howell III and Alesia Howell Clark, and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
