2. Patron: Head

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; proof of legal age required.

5. Summary: Provides that any person convicted of selling alcoholic beverages to an individual who the seller knows or has reason to believe is younger than 21 years of age is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The legislation also provides that any person who sells alcoholic beverages to someone less than 21 years of age and did not require identification proving the individual to be 21 years of age at time of sale shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor violation. The legislation excludes student identification cards as bona fide evidence of legal age.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final; See Item 8 below.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation does not appear to have a fiscal impact since the legislation establishes a new Class 3 misdemeanor (which could result in a fine up to \$500 being assessed for a violation).

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Local and regional jails statewide, State Compensation Board, local and state law enforcement agencies.
