2. Patron: Tata

3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Participation in interscholastic programs by students residing on a military or naval reservation.

5. Summary: Requires any student who resides on a military or naval reservation with military-owned housing located wholly or partly within the geographical boundaries of multiple school divisions to be deemed eligible for interscholastic programs immediately upon enrollment in a public elementary or secondary school in any of the aforementioned school divisions.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Since divisions already have staff required for interscholastic programs, the passage of this legislation should not have a state fiscal impact. The impact to school divisions should also be minimal given that such students would be eligible to participate in any interscholastic programs offered by the school but nothing in the legislation implies that such programs must be expanded to accommodate additional students.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Board of Education and local school divisions.
