**3. Committee:** Passed Both Houses

**4. Title:** Departments of Corrections and Juvenile Justice; powers and duties of the Director.

**5. Summary:** Provides the Directors of the Department of Corrections and the Department of Juvenile Justice with the power to designate certain employees with internal investigations authority within those departments as having the powers of law-enforcement officers to investigate criminal behavior affecting persons committed to those Departments. Such members shall be subject to any minimum training standard required by the Department of Criminal Justice Services for law-enforcement officers. The legislation adds “The Department shall investigate allegations of criminal behavior in accordance with a written agreement entered into with the Department of State Police” in two places. Both agencies currently act under an agreement with the Department of State Police.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Department of Corrections and the Department of State Police, the legislation will not have a fiscal impact on their agencies.
