3. Committee: Transportation

4. Title: State safety inspection fees.

5. Summary: Increases from \$16 to \$24 the maximum fee that can be charged for state safety inspections of "other vehicles." The bill also provides for the indexing of the maximum allowable fee for all vehicles based on the Consumer Price Index, beginning in calendar year 2016.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary; See Item 8 below.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of State Police, the proposal would not have a fiscal impact on the department since proposal does not change the amount going to the department for each vehicle inspection completed. The entire increase authorized by this proposal would be retained by the inspection stations. The estimated annual increase in revenue from inspecting approximately 7.5 million vehicles is \$60 million.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Vehicle safety inspection stations statewide.
