4. Title: Individual incapable of making an informed decision; procedure for physical evidence recovery kit

5. Summary: The substitute legislation provides that a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or nurse may perform a physical evidence recovery kit examination for a person who is believed to be the victim of a sexual assault and who is incapable of making an informed decision regarding consent to such examination when there is an immediate need to conduct the examination, no legally authorized representative is available to provide consent, and a capacity reviewer provides written certification that the person is incapable of providing informed consent and that the examination should be performed. The bill provides for the protection of a victim's identity and frees specified practitioners who exercise due care from liability.
