5. Summary: The proposed legislation clarifies the definition of “compounding” and adds a requirement for a current inspection report for registration or renewal of a registration for a nonresident pharmacy.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposal would require the Department of Health Professions to review additional inspection reports for compliance; however the workload associated with performing these reviews is estimated to be minimal. The bill could also result a small number of additional disciplinary actions. It is assumed that the Board of Pharmacy would be able handle the minimal costs associated with this bill within its current budget.
