1.	Title:	Pharmacies; clarifies definition of compounding, etc					

- 5. Summary: The enrolled legislation clarifies the definition of "compounding" and adds a requirement for a current inspection report for registration or renewal of a registration for a nonresident pharmacy. In addition, it requires that Board of Pharmacy be notified of any sterile compounded drug that is intended to be dispensed or delivered in the Commonwealth. Upon renewal, a pharmacy must notify the Board of its intention to continue dispensing or otherwise delivering sterile compounded drug products into the Commonwealth. The Board must also maintain this information in a manner that will allow the production of a list identifying all sterile compounding pharmacies.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposal would require the Department of Health Professions to review additional inspection reports for compliance and maintain a list of sterile compounding pharmacies; however the workload associated with these additional responsibilities is estimated to be minimal. The bill could also result a small number of additional disciplinary actions. It is assumed that the Board of Pharmacy would be able handle the minimal costs associated with this bill within its current budget.
