3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Parental rights; procedure for restoring to parent whose rights to his child have been terminated

5. Summary: The amended legislation creates a procedure for restoring parental rights to a parent whose rights to his child have previously been terminated when the child is at least 14 years of age and the child has not achieved his permanency goal. The bill also provides that the juvenile and domestic relations court may appoint a special advocate to provide services to a child who is the subject of judicial proceedings for the restoration of parental rights.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Social Services estimates that a minimal number of children will be impacted by the provisions of this bill. Therefore, the proposal is not expected to have any significant impact on workload or costs.
