3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Destruction of controlled substances, etc.; Department of State Police.

5. Summary: Requires law-enforcement reports on the destruction of seized controlled substances and other drugs and paraphernalia that under current law have to be submitted to the Board of Pharmacy to be submitted instead to the Department of State Police. The bill also requires the Department to maintain a listing of such submissions, make the list publicly available on the Department's website, and submit an annual report with such information to the General Assembly.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary; See Item 8 below.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of State Police, the estimated cost to implement the proposal is \$426,000 and includes project management, design, development, implementation and maintenance. The estimated cost does not include procurement of software and hardware since it not known if those items will be required. The estimated cost was derived by using costs from projects thought to be of similar size and complexity.
