2. Patron: Smith

3. Committee: Passed both houses

4. Title: Littering and illegal dumping; community service.

5. Summary: Currently, persons convicted of illegal dumping on public property, including highway rights-of-way, may volunteer to perform community service in litter pickup in lieu of jail time. Any amounts collected by the courts related to the sentence are to be deposited to the Highway Maintenance and Opportunity Fund (HMOF).

The proposed legislation would repeal this Code section and authorize courts to order a mandatory minimum of 10 hours of community service in litter pickup in lieu of sentencing the defendant to jail confinement.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: None.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill would amend the provisions related to performing community service instead of jail time for convictions related to illegal dumping on public property. Any impact to the HMOF cannot be determined at this time.
