**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** Schedule II, Schedule III, etc, controlled substances; required check with Program

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation requires that any prescriber who prescribes to a patient a controlled substance included in Schedule II, III, or IV of the Drug Control Act request and review information about that patient from the Prescription Monitoring Program. In addition, the prescriber must continue this review at least annually for so long as the controlled substance is prescribed to the patient.

**7. No Fiscal Impact**

**8. Fiscal Implications:** While this legislation is expected to increase the number of prescribers who must register as users of the Prescription Monitoring Program, the total number cannot be determined. However, the Department of Health Professions does not expect that increased PMP activity related to the provisions of this bill will necessitate additional revenue or staff.
