5. Summary: The proposed legislation would require posting of public notice when agencies receive unsolicited proposals through the Public Private Transportation Act of 1995 (PPTA). The notice is to be posted for 120 days on the Department of General Service's electronic procurement website (eVA) for the submission of any competing proposals and to allow public comment. The bill specifies certain information the notice is to include.

The bill also requires that once the negotiation phase is complete and a decision to award has been made by a responsible public entity, the major business points of the agreement must be posted on the eVA system and allow for public comment. The bill contains an enactment clause which states that the provisions of the bill apply only to proposals submitted on or after July 1, 2013.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation would require posting information regarding unsolicited PPTA bids on the state's procurement website. eVA is currently able to support the requirements of the bill without additional costs on the responsible public entities. The provisions of the bill are not expected to impact state finances.
