WHEREAS, Edward "Ed" Jones began his career with the *Free Lance-Star* as a high school intern; 10 after receiving a bachelor's degree from Harvard University and a law degree from the University of 11 Virginia, he returned to the paper as a reporter; and 12

WHEREAS, Ed Jones served the Free Lance-Star in positions of increasing responsibility over the 13 14 years and assumed the role of editor in 2001; and

WHEREAS, Ed Jones remained committed to the highest standards of journalistic excellence as he 15 led the *Free Lance-Star* through significant changes to the newspaper industry; and 16
