That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-2522.1 as follows: 10 § 54.1-2522.1. Requirements of prescribers. A. Any prescriber who is licensed in the Commonwealth and is authorized pursuant to §§ 54.1-3303 11 12 and 54.1-3408 to issue a prescription for a covered substance shall be registered with the Prescription Monitoring Program by the Department of Health Professions upon filing an application for licensure 13 14 or renewal of licensure, if the prescriber is not already registered. 15 B. Prescribers registered with the Prescription Monitoring Program shall, at the time of initiating a 16 new course of treatment to a human patient that includes the prescribing of benzodiazepine or an opiate anticipated to last more than 90 consecutive days and for which a treatment agreement is entered into, 17 request information from the Director for the purpose of determining what, if any, other covered 18 substances are currently prescribed to the patient. In addition, any prescriber who holds a special 19 20 identification number from the Drug Enforcement Administration authorizing the prescribing of controlled substances for opioid addiction therapy shall, prior to or as a part of execution of a 21 22 treatment agreement with the patient, request information from the Director for the purpose of determining what, if any, other covered substances the patient is currently being prescribed. Nothing in 23 24 this section shall prohibit prescribers from making additional periodic requests for information from the 25 Director as may be required by routine prescribing practices.

26 C. The Secretary of Health and Human Resources may identify and publish a list of benzodiazepines 27 or opiates that have a low potential for abuse by human patients. Prescribers who prescribe such identified benzodiazepines or opiates shall not be required to meet the provisions of subsection B. In 28 29 addition, a prescriber shall not be required to meet the provisions of subsection B if the course of 30 treatment arises from pain management relating to dialysis or cancer treatments.

2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on July 1, 2015. 31

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
