3	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-2423 [, 10.1-1422.03, 54.1-2911, 54.1-2912, and 54.1-2957.5 and
4	10.1-1422.03] of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Geographic Information Network
5	Advisory Board, Litter Control and Recycling Fund Advisory Board [, Board of Medicine, and
6	Advisory Board on Athletic Training]; membership and terms.

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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 2.2-2423 [, 10.1-1422.03, 54.1-2911, 54.1-2912, and 54.1-2957.5 and 10.1-1422.03] of the
13	Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 2.2-2423. Virginia Geographic Information Network Advisory Board; membership; terms;
15	quorum; compensation and expenses.
16	A. The Virginia Geographic Information Network Advisory Board (the Board) is hereby established
17	as an advisory board, within the meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government.
18	The Board shall advise the Geographic Information Network Division (the Division) of the Virginia
19	Information Technologies Agency on issues related to the exercise of the Division's powers and duties.
20	B. The Board shall consist of 18 16 members appointed as follows: nine seven nonlegislative citizen
21	members to be appointed by the Governor that consist of one agency director from one of the natural
22	resources agencies, one official from a state university, one elected official representing a local
23	government in the Commonwealth, one member of the Virginia Association of Surveyors, one elected
24	official who serves on a planning district commission, two representatives of utilities or transportation
25	industries one representative of a utility or transportation industry utilizing geographic data, and two
26	representatives of private businesses with expertise and experience in the establishment, operation, and
27	maintenance of geographic information systems; four members of the House of Delegates to be
28	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; two members of the Senate to be appointed by the
29	Senate Committee on Rules; the Chief Information Officer, the Commissioner of Highways, and the
30	Chief Executive Officer of the Economic Development Partnership Authority or their designees who
31	shall serve as ex officio, voting members. Gubernatorial appointees may be nonresidents of the
32	Commonwealth. All members of the Board appointed by the Governor shall be confirmed by each house
33	of the General Assembly. The agency director and state university official appointed by the Governor
34	may each designate a member of his organization as an alternate who may attend meetings in his place
35	and be counted as a member of the Board for the purposes of a quorum.
36	Any members of the Board who are representatives of private businesses that provide geographic
37 38	information services, and their companies, are precluded from contracting to provide goods or services
30 39	to the Division. C. Legislative members' terms shall be coincident with their terms of office. The gubernatorial
40	appointees to the Board shall serve five-year terms, except for the initial appointees whose terms were
4 0 4 1	staggered. Members appointed by the Governor shall serve no more than two consecutive five-year
42	terms. Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term.
43	Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. The remainder of any term to
44	which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's
45	eligibility to serve.
46	D. The Board shall elect from its membership a chairman, vice-chairman, and any other officers
47	deemed necessary. The duties and terms of the officers shall be prescribed by the members. A majority
48	of the Board shall constitute a quorum. The Board shall meet at least quarterly or at the call of its
49	chairman or the Chief Information Officer.
50	E. Legislative members of the Board shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12 and
51	nonlegislative citizen members shall receive such compensation as provided in § 2.2-2813 for their
52	services. All members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the
53	performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of
54	compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Virginia Geographic Information
55	Network Division of the Virginia Information Technologies Agency.
56	F. The Geographic Information Network Division shall provide staff support to the Board.
57	§ 10.1-1422.03. Membership, meetings, and staffing.
58	A. The Advisory Board shall consist of five persons appointed by the Governor. Three members

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59 shall represent persons paying the taxes which are deposited into the Fund and shall include one 60 member appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry associations representing retailers; 61 one member appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry associations representing soft

62 drink distributors; and one member appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry associations representing beer distributors. One member shall be a local litter or recycling coordinator. 63

64 One member shall be from the general public.

B. The initial terms of the members of the Advisory Board shall expire July 1, 1999, and five 65 members shall be appointed or reappointed effective July 1, 1999, for terms as follows: one member 66 shall be appointed for a term of one year; one member shall be appointed for a term of two years; one 67 member shall be appointed for a term of three years; and two members shall be appointed for terms of four years unless found to violate subsection E of this section. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for **68** 69 terms of four years except for appointments to fill vacancies, which shall be for the unexpired term. 70 They shall not receive a per diem, compensation for their service, or travel expenses. 71

C. The Advisory Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among its members. 72 The Advisory Board shall meet at least twice annually on such dates and at such times as they 73 74 determine. Three members of the Advisory Board shall constitute a quorum.

75 D. Staff support and actual associated administrative expenses of the Advisory Board shall be 76 provided by the Department from funds allocated from the Fund.

77 E. Any member who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Advisory Board, as certified 78 by the Chairman of the Advisory Board to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, shall be dismissed as a 79 member of the Advisory Board. The replacement of any dismissed member shall be appointed pursuant to subsection A of this section and meet the same membership criteria as the member who has been 80 dismissed. Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term. No person shall be eligible to serve on the Advisory Board for more than two terms. [§ 54.1-2911. 84 The Board of Medicine shall consist of one five medical physician physicians from each congressional district as diverse geographic regions as practicable, one osteopathic physician, one 85 podiatrist, one chiropractor, two obstetrician-gynecologists, one cardiologist, one general surgeon, one 86 87 internal medicine physician, one radiologist, and four citizen members. No two citizen members shall 88 reside in the same congressional district. Citizen members shall have all voting and participation rights 89 of other members. The term of office of the members of the Board shall be four years. If any medical 90 physician member of the Board ceases to reside in the district from which he was appointed, except by 91 reason of redistricting, his office shall be deemed vacant.

92 The officers of the Board shall be a president, a vice-president, and a secretary, who shall also act as 93 treasurer, who shall be members of and selected by the Board.

94 Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at such times and places as prescribed by the Board. 95 Special meetings may be held upon the call of the president and any 11 members. Twelve members of 96 the Board shall constitute a quorum.

The Board may establish an executive committee composed of the president, vice-president, the 97 98 secretary, and five other members of the Board appointed by the president. The executive committee 99 shall include at least two citizen members. In the absence of the Board, the executive committee shall have full powers to take any action and conduct any business authorized by this chapter. Five members 100 101 of the executive committee shall constitute a quorum. Any actions or business conducted by the 102 executive committee shall be acted upon by the full Board as soon as practicable.

There shall be an executive director for the Board of Medicine who shall be licensed or eligible for 103 104 licensure in the Commonwealth as a physician. 105

§ 54.1-2912. Nominations.

Nominations may be made for the medical physicians from a list of three eight names submitted to 106 107 the Governor by the Medical Society of Virginia and the osteopathic physician, podiatrist and, 108 chiropractor, obstetrician-gynecologists, cardiologist, general surgeon, internal medicine physician, and 109 radiologist members, respectively, from a list of at least three names submitted by June 1 of each year 110 by their respective state societies. In no case shall the Governor be bound to make any appointment from among the nominees of the respective societies. The Governor may notify the society, which may 111 112 make nominations, of any professional vacancy other than by expiration among the members of the 113 Board representing the particular profession and like nominations may be made for the filling of the 114 vacancy.

<u>§ 54.1-2957.5. Advisory Board on Athletic Training established; duties; composition;</u> 115 116 appointment; terms.

A. The Advisory Board on Athletic Training shall assist the Board in formulating its requirements for the licensure of athletic trainers. In the exercise of this responsibility, the Advisory Board shall 117 118 119 recommend to the Board the criteria for licensure of athletic trainers and the standards of professional conduct for licensees. The Advisory Board shall also assist in such other matters relating to the practice 120

121 of athletic training as the Board may require.

122 B. The Advisory Board shall consist of five members appointed by the Governor for four-year terms. 123 The first appointments shall provide for staggered terms with two members being appointed for a 124 two-year term, two members being appointed for a three year term and one member being appointed for 125 a four-year term. Three members shall be at the time of appointment athletic trainers who are currently 126 licensed by the Board and who have practiced in Virginia for not less than three years, including one 127 athletic trainer employed at a secondary school, one employed at an institution of higher education, and 128 one employed in the private sector; one member shall be a physician licensed to practice medicine in the 129 Commonwealth; and one member shall be a citizen appointed by the Governor from the Commonwealth 130 at large.

131 Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term. No 132 person shall be eligible to serve on the Advisory Board for more than two full consecutive terms.

133 2. That this act shall not be construed to affect existing appointments to the Virginia Geographic
134 Information Network Advisory Board or the Board of Medicine. However, all new appointments

135 made on or after July 1, 2014, shall be made in accordance with the provisions of this act.
