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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 54.1-2957.17 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Article 4 of Chapter 29 of Title 54.1 a section numbered 54.1-2957.18, relating to 3 4 behavior analysis; licensure.

7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 54.1-2957.17 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of 8 9 Virginia is amended by adding in Article 4 of Chapter 29 of Title 54.1 a section numbered 10 54.1-2957.18 as follows: 11

§ 54.1-2957.17. Exceptions to licensure requirements.

12 A. The provisions of § 54.1-2957.16 shall not be construed as prohibiting any professional licensed, 13 certified, or registered by a health regulatory board from acting within the scope of his practice.

B. The provisions of § 54.1-2957.16 shall not be construed as prohibiting or restricting the applied 14 15 behavior analysis activities of a student participating in a defined course, internship, practicum, or program of study at a college or university, provided such activities are supervised by a member of the 16 17 faculty of the college or university or by a licensed behavior analyst and such student does not hold himself out as a licensed behavior analyst and is identified as a "behavior analyst student," "behavior 18 19 analyst intern," or "behavior analyst trainee."

20 C. The provisions of § 54.1-2957.16 shall not be construed as prohibiting or restricting the activities 21 of unlicensed individuals pursuing supervised experiential training to meet eligibility requirements for certification by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board or for state licensure, provided such activities 22 are supervised by a licensed behavior analyst who has been approved by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board to provide supervision, the individual does not hold himself out as a licensed 23 24 25 behavior analyst, and no more than five years have elapsed from the date on which the supervised 26 experiential training began.

27 D. The provisions of § 54.1-2957.16 shall not be construed as prohibiting or restricting the activities 28 of an individual employed by a school board or by a school for students with disabilities licensed by the 29 Board of Education from providing behavior analysis when such behavior analysis is performed as part 30 of the regular duties of his office or position and he receives no compensation in excess of the compensation he regularly receives for the performance of the duties of his office or position. No person 31 32 exempted from licensure pursuant to this subsection shall hold himself out as a licensed behavior 33 analyst or a licensed assistant behavior analyst unless he holds a license as such issued by the Board. 34

§ 54.1-2957.18. Advisory Board on Behavior Analysis.

35 A. The Advisory Board on Behavior Analysis (Advisory Board) shall assist the Board in carrying out 36 the provisions of this chapter regarding the qualifications, examination, and regulation of licensed 37 behavior analysts and licensed assistant behavior analysts.

38 B. The Advisory Board shall consist of five members appointed by the Governor for four-year terms 39 as follows: two members shall be, at the time of appointment, licensed behavior analysts who have 40 practiced for at least three years; one member shall be, at the time of appointment, a licensed assistant 41 behavior analyst who has practiced for not less than three years; one member shall be a physician 42 licensed by the Board who is familiar with the principles of behavior analysis; and one member shall be 43 a consumer of applied behavior analysis who does not hold a license as a behavior analyst or assistant 44 behavior analyst who is appointed by the Governor from the Commonwealth at large. Vacancies 45 occurring other than by expiration of terms shall be filled for the unexpired term.

C. The Advisory Board shall, under the authority of the Board, recommend to the Board for its 46 enactment into regulation the criteria for licensure as a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior 47 **48** analyst and the standards of professional conduct for holders of such licenses.

49 The Advisory Board shall also assist in such other matters relating to behavior analysis as the Board 50 in its discretion may direct.

2. That the initial terms for the members appointed to the Advisory Board on Behavior Analysis 51 52 pursuant to § 54.1-2957.18 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, shall be staggered as 53 follows: two members shall be appointed for one-year terms, two members shall be appointed for two-year terms, and one member shall be appointed for a three-year term. 54

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
