2 3 Celebrating the life of Lieutenant Sean Christopher Snyder. 4

6 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Sean Christopher Snyder of Virginia Beach, a man of true honor and a hero 7 who considered it a distinct privilege to serve his country as an officer and as a helicopter pilot in the United States Navy, died on January 8, 2014, during a training mission off the coast of the 8 9 Commonwealth of Virginia; and

10 WHEREAS, while serving with Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron 15, Lieutenant Snyder served with unwavering dedication and courage, making multiple deployments to the island nation of 11 12 Bahrain in the Arabian Gulf; and

13 WHEREAS, while providing support to United States Naval Forces Central Command Fifth Fleet 14 operations during Operation Enduring Freedom, Lieutenant Snyder served as mission commander, 15 leading a Sikorsky MH-53E Sea Dragon helicopter crew in the execution of airborne mine countermeasures operations to successfully deter seaborne mining efforts in the Arabian Gulf; and 16

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Snyder's actions directly supported the success of the United States and 17 multinational forces in ensuring that sea lines of communication, which are vital for seaborne 18 19 international trade, remained open; and

WHEREAS, as part of an elite cadre, Lieutenant Snyder flew the MH-53E from Bahrain to Ghazi 20 21 Air Base, Pakistan, in support of humanitarian relief and lifesaving operations after the devastating 22 floods in July and August of 2010, executing a tactically demanding flight through tenuous international 23 airspace with stops in Oman and on the USS PELELIU in the Indian Ocean; and

24 WHEREAS, in continuous flight operations to and from the remote region of Colamb in the Swat 25 Valley, Lieutenant Snyder demonstrated exceptional airmanship and dedication to mission, resulting in 26 the rescue of over 2,500 Pakistani citizens and the movement of nearly one million pounds of relief 27 supplies; and

28 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Snyder's professionalism and leadership merited numerous awards and 29 commendations throughout his 21 years of honorable service in the United States Navy; rising from 30 enlisted to officer ranks, amassing 1,576 total flight hours, and gaining widespread recognition within the naval aviator community as one of the most highly skilled and respected instructors, Lieutenant 31 32 Snyder was a trusted mentor whose open-door style of leadership had a deep and lasting impact on all 33 Sailors and Marines with whom he served; and

34 WHEREAS, in word and deed, Lieutenant Snyder was known and admired as a true servant of others who was motivated by his sincere and passionate faith in Jesus Christ, which he shared through 35 36 countless hours of devoted service as an elder and a youth leader at Glad Tidings Church in Norfolk, 37 where the impact of his life will continue in the lives of those he touched; and

38 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Snyder will be forever remembered and deeply missed by his beloved wife, 39 Amy, with whom he shared great love and joy throughout their marriage; sons, Sean II, Brady, and 40 Ethan; daughter, Makayla; and numerous other family members, friends, and fellow members of the 41 United States Navy; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 42 note with great sadness the loss of a devoted husband and father and an honorable servant in both his 43 sacred faith and his esteemed service to the United States of America, Lieutenant Sean Christopher 44 45 Snyder; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 46 for presentation to the family of Lieutenant Sean Christopher Snyder as an expression of the General 47 48 Assembly's respect for his memory.
