10	WHEREAS, Virginia Governor's Schools provide some of the state's most able students academically
11	and artistically challenging programs beyond those offered in their home schools; and
12	WHEREAS, Academic-Year Governor's Schools are established as "joint schools" and are typically
13	managed by a regional governing board of representatives from the school boards of each participating
14	school division; and
15	WHEREAS, with the support of the Board of Education and the General Assembly, the Governor's
16	Schools presently include summer residential and regional programs and academic-year programs serving
17	approximately 7,500 gifted students from all parts of the state; and
18 19	WHEREAS, the Board of Education must approve proposals for new or expanding Governor's
<b>19</b> <b>20</b>	Schools; and WHEREAS, Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology in Fairfax was recently
<b>2</b> 0 <b>2</b> 1	ranked the number four high school in the nation in 2013 by U.S. News & World Report; and
$\overline{22}$	WHEREAS, the Joint Subcommittee to Study Science, Math, and Technology Education in the
23	Commonwealth at the Elementary, Secondary, and Undergraduate Levels (HJR 25, 2006, and HJR 90,
24	2008), charged with reviewing and recommending innovative ways to interest students in math, science,
25	and technology, in its final report agreed that Thomas Jefferson High School is a pioneer and any efforts
26	by other local school divisions to reproduce such a model should be encouraged; and
27	WHEREAS, the outstanding demand for admission to Thomas Jefferson High School demonstrates
28 29	the need for the creation of similar programs in Northern Virginia, and similar demand may exist
29 30	throughout the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Board of Education
30 31	determine the need for additional mathematics, science, and technology Governor's Schools in the
32	Commonwealth. The Board shall develop a plan by December 31, 2014 to establish such schools or
33	similar academic programs, including an estimate of the funding required.
34	The Board shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary and
35	report of its progress in meeting the request of this resolution no later than the first day of the 2015
36	Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary and report shall be submitted for
37	publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
38	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General
39	Assembly's website.
