That § 54.1-2800 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: §54.1-2807.02. Absence of next of kin. 13 14 In the absence of a next of kin, a person designated to make arrangements for the decedent's burial 15 or the disposition of his remains pursuant to § 54.1-2825, or an agent named in an advance directive pursuant to § 54.1-2984 or the failure or refusal of such next of kin, designated person, or agent to 16 accept responsibility for the disposition of the decedent, then any other person over 18 years of age who 17 is able to provide positive identification of the deceased and is willing to pay for the costs associated 18 with the disposition of the decedent's remains, shall be authorized to make arrangements for such 19 20 disposition of the decedent's remains. If a funeral service establishment or funeral service licensee 21 makes arrangements with a person other than a next of kin, designated person, or agent in accordance 22 with this section, then the funeral service licensee or funeral service establishment shall be immune from 23 civil liability unless such act, decision, or omission resulted from bad faith or malicious intent. 24 § 54.1-2818.1. Prerequisites for cremation. 25 No dead human body shall be cremated without permission of the medical examiner as required by 26 § 32.1-284 and visual identification of the deceased by the next-of-kin or his representative, who may be

any person designated to make arrangements for the decedent's burial or the disposition of his remains 27 pursuant to § 54.1-2825, an agent named in an advance directive pursuant to § 54.1-2984, or a sheriff, 28 29 upon court order, if no next-of-kin, designated person, or agent is available either a sheriff, upon court 30 order, or any person over 18 years of age who is able to provide visual identification and is willing to pay the costs of cremation pursuant to § 54.1-2807.02. When visual identification is not feasible, other 31 32 positive identification of the deceased may be used as a prerequisite for cremation. Unless such act, 33 decision, or omission resulted from bad faith or malicious intent, the funeral service establishment, 34 funeral service licensee, or the sheriff shall be immune from civil liability for any act, decision, or 35 omission resulting from cremation.

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
