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10	WHEREAS, Virginia's manufacturing sector is a key economic driver of the Virginia economy and is
11	a significant user of raw materials and energy; and
12	WHEREAS, an increasing number of Virginia manufacturers are using recycled material in the
13	manufacturing process as a way to reduce energy consumption, curtail adverse environmental effects,
14 15	and become more competitive; and WHEREAS, the use of recycled material in the manufacturing process presents an economic
16	opportunity in the creation of new Virginia markets for recycled material; and
17	WHEREAS, it is in the Commonwealth's interest to foster the creation and expansion of new markets
18	for recycled material in Virginia and to ensure that Virginia manufacturers are able to source recycled
19	material within the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it
20	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Manufacturing Development
21	Commission be directed to study the economic and environmental benefits of the use of recycled
22	material in the manufacturing process in Virginia. In addition, the Manufacturing Development
23 24	Commission (Commission) shall make recommendations on ways to enhance the market for recycled
24 25	material to the benefit of Virginia manufacturers and suppliers. The Office of the Clerk of the Senate shall provide administrative staff support. The Division of
2 6	Legislative Services shall provide legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the
27	Commission. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Commission by the Department of
28	Environmental Quality. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission
29	for this study, upon request.
30	The Manufacturing Development Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2014,
31	and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary
32 33	of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2015 Regular Session of the
33 34	General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a
35	House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the
36	procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents
37	and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
