3. Committee: Privileges and Elections

4. Title: Chief and assistant chief election officers; appointment, qualifications and terms of officers.

5. Summary: Elections; officers of elections; chief and assistant chief election officers. Allows the chief and assistant chief election officers to be nonpartisan if a representative for one or both of the two political parties receiving the largest number of votes in the preceding gubernatorial election is unavailable. The electoral board shall provide notice to representatives of both parties at least ten days prior to the election that it intends to use nonaffiliated officers so that each party has the opportunity to provide additional candidates.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: The State Board of Elections (SBE) indicates that this bill should not have a material fiscal impact on SBE or localities. The tracking of officer party affiliations is already required. The bill's amendment is technical in nature and did not affect the fiscal impact estimate.
