**3. Committee:** Passed Both Houses

**4. Title:** Virginia state lottery; lottery sales agent license suspension, etc.

**5. Summary:** Provides that in the event an applicant is a former lottery sales agent whose license was suspended, revoked, or refused renewal, no application for a new license to sell lottery tickets or shares shall be considered for a minimum period of 90 days following the suspension, revocation, or refusal to renew. The bill contains technical amendments.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No state fiscal impact. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** None. The Lottery reports that this bill is not expected to have any fiscal impact on the agency.

Establishing a clear guideline with a 90 day waiting period before applications for a new license to sell lottery products are considered following the loss of a license, if anything, could potentially mildly decrease the workload of the agency by decreasing the number of applications under consideration at a given time. This potential for a decrease in workload would not be expected to have any material impact on the agency, as the number of applicants the bill will affect is expected to be minimal.
