4. Title: Mental health education and training for first responders.

5. Summary: The substitute bill provides that the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services shall encourage the dissemination of information about and provision of training in the implementation of evidence-based strategies to prevent and minimize mental health crises for first responders. The Department shall also disseminate information and provide training that addresses the signs and symptoms of mental illness and ways law-enforcement personnel, emergency medical services personnel, and other first responders can assist individuals experiencing mental health crises.
