4. Title: Passive collection and use of personal information by law enforcement agencies.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation provides that unless a criminal or administrative warrant has been issued, law enforcement and regulatory agencies shall not use any technology to collect or maintain personal information in a passive manner where such data is of unknown relevance and is not intended for prompt evaluation and potential use respecting suspected criminal activity or terrorism by any individual or organization.
