- **5. Summary:** The proposed legislation would prohibit a member or employee of a local school board or the Board of Education from transmitting personally identifiable information from a student's record to a federal government agency or an authorized representative of such agency for purposes permitted by local, state, or federal law unless the member or employee first notifies the student's parent and provides the parent or student with the opportunity to opt out of the transmission.
- 6. Budget Amendment Necessary: None.
- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate. See Item 8.
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill limits the ability of members or employees of local school boards or the Board of Education from transmitting personally identifiable information from a student's record. The bill will likely have an administrative staffing impact to school divisions and the state related to administering the required parental notification and opt out processes for personally identifiable information covered under the bill. Modifications to existing computer systems would likely need to be made as well to allow for adjusted data files containing omitted data due to parental opt outs.
- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Board of Education, Department of Education, local school divisions
- **10. Technical Amendment Necessary:** The bill identifies employees of the Board of Education. The Board of Education does not have employees. The bill should be revised to include members of the Board of Education and employees of the Department of Education.
