4.	Title:	False advertisement for locksmith services; penalty.					

- 5. Summary: Provides that any medium that publishes an advertisement by an unregistered locksmith for the provision of locksmith services after being notified by the Criminal Justices Services Board that such person is unregistered is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor and may be subject to a maximum civil monetary penalty of \$2,500. Venue for a prosecution of this crime lies in the jurisdiction where the unlawful act occurs or where a member of the public accessed the advertisement.

- **7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary; See Item 8 below.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: Although insufficient data exists to determine the fiscal impact due to this proposal, the proposed legislation could result in an increase in the jail population since Class 1 misdemeanor outcomes result in sentences of up to 12 months in jail (and a fine up to \$2,500). Any increase in jail population will increase costs to the state. The Commonwealth presently pays the localities \$4.00 a day for each misdemeanant or otherwise local responsible prisoner held in a jail. It also funds most of the jails' operating costs, e.g. correctional officers. The state's share of these costs on a per prisoner, per day basis varies from locality to locality. However, according to the Compensation Board's FY2012 Jail Cost Report (November 1, 2013), the estimated total state support for local and regional jails averaged \$30.06 per state inmate, per day in FY 2012.

Any monetary penalty shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the Literary Fund.
