4. Title: Commission on Civics Education reestablished.

5. Summary: The enrolled bill reestablishes the Commission on Civics Education, which expired on June 30, 2013. The new sunset date is set at July 1, 2017. The bill sets membership at 15, consisting of eight legislative members, six nonlegislative citizen members, and one ex officio member. Legislative membership is set at five from the House and three from the Senate. The bill establishes a Commission on Civics Education Fund to consist of gifts, grants, donations, bequests, or other funds from any source as may be received by the Commission for its work. Enactment clauses state that, other than any funds provided by the appropriation act, no general funds are to be used to support the Commission and that the provisions of the bill will not become effective until nongeneral funds have been received by the Commission to support the conduct of its work.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Commission on Civics Education is expected to be funded entirely by private donations. Any other costs or interim compensation for legislative members will be covered from existing appropriations.
