5. Summary: Adds to the list of persons entitled to vote by absentee ballot those persons who are 65 years of age or older on or before the day of the election for which an absentee ballot is sought. The bill requires the application for absentee ballot from such persons to include proof of age in a form specified by the State Board of Elections.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the State Board of Elections (SBE), the proposed legislation is expected to increase the number of voters eligible to vote absentee. The cost to the SBE includes a change to the voter registration system (\$2,500), changes to forms, web materials, guidance documents (\$2,200), and for printing and distribution of new forms (\$6,000).

The total cost of processing the absentee ballots at the local registrar's office would increase. Currently, the cost to send an absentee ballot is \$1.75 for mailed ballots plus the staff time needed to review ballot requests. In addition, staff time would increase for processing inperson absentee voting.
