4. Title: Virginia-recognized Indian Tribes.

5. Summary: Provides that on any Indian Reservation recognized by the Commonwealth whereupon a state-recognized Indian Tribe has contracted with one or more qualified firms or individuals to perform building official functions, under the Uniform Statewide Building Code (§ 36-97 et seq.) or equivalent Tribal Law, on the Reservation, neither the Commonwealth nor any locality therein is responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of the Uniform Statewide Building Code.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: House Bill 902 exempts the Commonwealth or any locality from enforcing the Uniform Statewide Building Code and delegates the building inspection authority to state-recognized Indian Tribes. The proposed legislation also requires state-recognized Indian Tribes to retain a qualified firm or individual to conduct building inspections.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Community Housing and Development

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: Legislation is similar to HB1094.
