**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the State Board of Elections (SBE), the proposed legislation is expected to increase the number of voters eligible to vote absentee. The cost to the SBE includes a change to the voter registration system (\$2,500), changes to forms, web materials, guidance documents (\$2,200), and for printing and distribution of new forms (\$6,000).

The total cost of processing the absentee ballots at the local registrar's office would increase. Currently, the cost to send an absentee ballot is \$1.75 for mailed ballots plus the staff time needed to review ballot requests. In addition, staff time would increase for processing inperson absentee voting.
