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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 62.1-44.15:52 of the Code of Virginia, relating to exemption from 3 erosion and sediment control requirements for routine highway maintenance projects.

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### Approved

#### 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

#### 7 1. That § 62.1-44.15:52 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 62.1-44.15:52. Virginia Erosion and Sediment Control Program.

9 A. The Board shall develop a program and adopt regulations in accordance with the Administrative 10 Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) for the effective control of soil erosion, sediment deposition, and nonagricultural runoff that shall be met in any control program to prevent the unreasonable degradation 11 12 of properties, stream channels, waters, and other natural resources. Stream restoration and relocation 13 projects that incorporate natural channel design concepts are not man-made channels and shall be exempt from any flow rate capacity and velocity requirements for natural or man-made channels as 14 15 defined in any regulations promulgated pursuant to this section or § 62.1-44.15:54 or 62.1-44.15:65. Any plan approved prior to July 1, 2014, that provides for stormwater management that addresses any flow 16 17 rate capacity and velocity requirements for natural or man-made channels shall satisfy the flow rate 18 capacity and velocity requirements for natural or man-made channels if the practices are designed to (i) 19 detain the water quality volume and to release it over 48 hours; (ii) detain and release over a 24-hour 20 period the expected rainfall resulting from the one-year, 24-hour storm; and (iii) reduce the allowable peak flow rate resulting from the 1.5-year, two-year, and 10-year, 24-hour storms to a level that is less 21 than or equal to the peak flow rate from the site assuming it was in a good forested condition, achieved 22 23 through multiplication of the forested peak flow rate by a reduction factor that is equal to the runoff 24 volume from the site when it was in a good forested condition divided by the runoff volume from the 25 site in its proposed condition, and shall be exempt from any flow rate capacity and velocity requirement 26 for natural or man-made channels as defined in regulations promulgated pursuant to § 62.1-44.15:54 or 27 62.1-44.15:65. For plans approved on and after July 1, 2014, the flow rate capacity and velocity 28 requirements of this subsection shall be satisfied by compliance with water quantity requirements in the 29 Stormwater Management Act (§ 62.1-44.15:24 et seq.) and attendant regulations, unless such 30 land-disturbing activities are in accordance with the grandfathering provisions of the Virginia Stormwater 31 Management Program (VSMP) Permit Regulations or exempt pursuant to subdivision C 7 of 32 § 62.1-44.15:34.

The regulations shall:

34 1. Be based upon relevant physical and developmental information concerning the watersheds and 35 drainage basins of the Commonwealth, including, but not limited to, data relating to land use, soils, hydrology, geology, size of land area being disturbed, proximate water bodies and their characteristics, 36 37 transportation, and public facilities and services;

38 2. Include such survey of lands and waters as may be deemed appropriate by the Board or required 39 by any applicable law to identify areas, including multijurisdictional and watershed areas, with critical 40 erosion and sediment problems; and

41 3. Contain conservation standards for various types of soils and land uses, which shall include 42 criteria, techniques, and methods for the control of erosion and sediment resulting from land-disturbing 43 activities.

B. The Board shall provide technical assistance and advice to, and conduct and supervise educational 44 45 programs for VESCP authorities.

46 C. The Board shall adopt regulations establishing minimum standards of effectiveness of erosion and 47 sediment control programs, and criteria and procedures for reviewing and evaluating the effectiveness of VESCPs. In developing minimum standards for program effectiveness, the Board shall consider 48 49 information and standards on which the regulations promulgated pursuant to subsection A are based.

50 D. The Board shall approve VESCP authorities and shall periodically conduct a comprehensive program compliance review and evaluation to ensure that all VESCPs operating under the jurisdiction of 51 52 this article meet minimum standards of effectiveness in controlling soil erosion, sediment deposition, and 53 nonagricultural runoff. The Department shall develop a schedule for conducting periodic reviews and 54 evaluations of the effectiveness of VESCPs unless otherwise directed by the Board. Such reviews where 55 applicable shall be coordinated with those being implemented in accordance with the Stormwater 56 Management Act (§ 62.1-44.15:24 et seq.) and associated regulations and the Chesapeake Bay

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57 Preservation Act (§ 62.1-44.15:67 et seq.) and associated regulations. The Department may also conduct
58 a comprehensive or partial program compliance review and evaluation of a VESCP at a greater
59 frequency than the standard schedule.

60 E. The Board shall issue certificates of competence concerning the content, application, and intent of 61 specified subject areas of this article and accompanying regulations, including program administration, plan review, and project inspection, to personnel of program authorities and to any other persons who 62 have completed training programs or in other ways demonstrated adequate knowledge. The Department 63 shall administer education and training programs for specified subject areas of this article and 64 accompanying regulations, and is authorized to charge persons attending such programs reasonable fees 65 to cover the costs of administering the programs. Such education and training programs shall also 66 67 contain expanded components to address plan review and project inspection elements of the Stormwater 68 Management Act (§ 62.1-44.15:24 et seq.) and attendant regulations in accordance with § 62.1-44.15:30.

69 F. Department personnel conducting inspections pursuant to this article shall hold a certificate of competence as provided in subsection E.
